



WHY RURAL?

Out of Sight, Out of Mind

Rural schools do their best to provide for their students, but often face significant challenges—inadequate financing, trouble recruiting and retaining teachers, and inaccessible or unaffordable services for children and families. We believe these students deserve equal access to a great education, so we work directly with stakeholders to ensure that our support is thoughtful, sustainable, and fits with each community's needs. Each partnership request is carefully evaluated by our advisory committees to determine alignment with the foundation's mission and resources. Our grassroots, hands-on approach means that all partners receive a site visit—an important step in lending our eyes and ears to each and every project.

2021 PROJECTS

Akron High School | Akron, CO (Eastern Plains) Construction Science vocational training program development.

Bennett School District | Bennet, CO (Eastern Plains)

English language class support (after-hours) for the parent community.

The goal is to equip parents with the language skills needed to be able to be more active participants in their child's learning.

Byers Elementary School | CO (Eastern Plains) Musical instruments including 25 guitars, 50 recorders, classroom handbell set, percussion instruments, and music stands. Facilitated by the Future Arts Foundation through a grant from Friends of Nathan Yip.

Center Consolidated School | Center, CO (San Luis Valley) Home Visit Program (on hold in 2020 due to COVID safety concerns). Teachers conduct in-home visits with the goal of increasing parental engagement and support to better understand the whole child.

Generation Schools Network | Statewide (CO) Student-Centered Accountability Program (S-CAP) support. S-CAP is a network of rural districts engaging in hosted visits to network and provide real-time peer to peer feedback. Lone Star School | Otis, CO (Eastern Plains)

Adulting 101 Program support. Students earn badges for a series of lessons not traditionally taught in school. Badge programs include doing laundry, changing a tire, personal finance, healthy relationships, etc.

Monte Vista High School | Monte Vista, CO (San Luis Valley) Home Visit Program (see Center Consolidated School description).

Mt. Evans BOCES | Bailey, Blackhawk, & Idaho Springs, CO *Informational text reading intervention software.*

Peakview School | Walsenburg, CO (south central) Supplies for take-home activity kits for special education students.

Vilas School District | Vilas, CO (southeast)

Career Pathways vocational training program development.

Ute Mountain Ute Tribe | Towaoc, CO (southwest)

Ute culture-focused outdoor education program for 20 middle and high school students. Additional support from the Donnell Kay Foundation and several major outdoor brands like REI, Yeti, and more.

Weld County School District | Johnstown, CO (north central) General Construction vocational training program development.
