

# Announcing a NEW Multi-Year Grant Opportunity for Rural Colorado School Districts!

In celebration of **ten years** of championing rural education in Colorado, the **Nathan Yip Foundation** is proud to launch a bold **new multi-year grant opportunity** for rural K–12 school districts across the state. This initiative is grounded in a belief that **teachers are the heart of innovation and vision** in rural schools. We invite districts to **build their proposals by partnering with educators** who see what's possible—those closest to students and classrooms—while district leaders provide the structure, stewardship, and sustainability needed to bring these ideas to life. **This new grant philosophy represents an evolution of our funding approach and will replace the individual school, district, and teacher grants we've supported in the past.** 

At its core, this grant is about supporting the **whole student**—academically, socially, and emotionally—through bold ideas and strong relationships. We are seeking **teacher-driven**, **district-supported** proposals that reflect shared aspirations for student success. Superintendents will formally submit the application with a **Lead Teacher and a team of committed educators** who will collaborate to design and carry out the work. We encourage districts to empower these teams to **dream big** and lead the creation of strategic, student-centered plans that respond to local needs and build lasting impact across their schools and communities.

# **©** Our Funding Priorities

We invite districts to submit strategic, student-centered proposals focused on one or more of the following priority areas:

- Career Exploration & Workforce Pathways: Create hands-on career-connected learning aligned with local industries, helping students see a future in their communities.
- **Early Literacy:** Strengthen reading instruction and family engagement in literacy, ensuring all students build strong foundations in the early grades.
- **Equitable Academic Access:** Increase opportunities for rural students to participate in advanced coursework, concurrent enrollment, and inclusive learning experiences.
- **Family & Community Partnerships**: Foster collaboration with families and local partners to boost student attendance, engagement, and success.
- **STEAM Education & Creative Expression:** Expand access to integrated science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics learning experiences that foster creativity, critical thinking, and student identity through hands-on, interdisciplinary exploration.
- **Student Mental Health & Belonging:** Expand mental health supports, social-emotional learning (SEL), and relationship-building practices.

Public rural Colorado school districts (must be submitted by the Superintendent and a Lead Teacher)

**Total Award:** Up to \$75,000 over three years

Year 1: up to \$30,000Year 2: up to \$25,000Year 3: up to \$20,000

Grant Announcement: February 1, 2026

Grant Disbursement: no later than May 1, 2026

# What We're Looking For

We're seeking **bold**, **thoughtful**, **and strategic proposals** with a clear three-year vision for improving student outcomes. Proposals should respond to local challenges and outline **sustainable**, **relationship-centered strategies** that will leave a lasting impact on students, families, and communities.

In our inaugural cohort, we will fund 5–7 rural school district proposals. It is our goal to walk alongside each district over the full three years, bringing additional financial, community, and business support to help rural students thrive—now and into the future.

## Ongoing Partnership & Leadership Expectations

If your district is selected for funding, we ask that the **Superintendent and Lead Teacher attend the Nathan Yip Foundation's Chinese New Year Gala in Denver on Saturday, February 21st**, at NYF's expense, where you'll have the opportunity to share your vision with our supporters.

**Superintendents and Lead Teachers** will also participate in **two virtual cohort calls per year** to reflect on successes, share challenges, and identify areas of need. Our goal is to build **sustainable**, **shareable implementation plans** so students across rural Colorado benefit from your learning and leadership.
